Moshe went and spoke to the people, saying, "I am a hundred and twenty years old today; I can no longer go out and come in, for YHWH has said to me, 'You shall not cross this Yarden (Jordan).' YHWH, your Elohim - He will cross before you; He will destroy these nations from before you, and you shall possess them; Yehoshua - he shall cross over before you, as YHWH has spoken. YHWH will do to them as He did to Sichon and Og, the kings of the Amorite, and their land, which He destroyed, and YHWH gave them before you; and you shall do to them according to the entire commandment that I have commanded you. Be strong and courageous, do not be afraid and do not be broken before them, for YHWH your Elohim - it is He who goes before you, He will not release you nor will He forsake you."

After that he brought Yehoshua before the people and told him to be strong and courageous when he brought the people to the land.

Moshe, then, told the kohanim (priests) that every seven years, during Sukkot, they were to read the entire Torah to the Children of Yisrael.

Moshe's end was drawing near, so YHWH had Moshe bring Yehoshua before Him so He could instruct him. Soon after, YHWH told Moshe to sing a song, which will be in the next Parasha.
