YHWH wrote the commandments on the tablets of stone that YHWH had made. While He was talking with Moshe, the people complained that they didn't know what became of Moshe, so they told Aharon to make them an idol. Aharon gathered up everyone's gold earring jewelry and made a golden calf. YHWH was very angry and sent Moshe down the mountain.

When Moshe saw the people worshipping the calf, he threw down the tablets and broke them. He ground up the calf, dumped the powder into the water, and made the people drink it. Moshe asked Aharon what had happened and he replied, "They said to me, 'Make us an elohim that will go before us, for this man Moshe, who brought us up from the land of Mitzrayim, we do not know what became of him.' So I said to them, 'Who has gold?' They removed it and gave it to me. I threw it into the fire, and the calf emerged." About three thousand people died that day because of their sin, and the next day there was a plague.

After a while, Moshe went back up the mountain for new tablets. YHWH passed by him, and showed him His glory. When Moshe descended the mountain his face shone brightly. He had to wear a mask when he was before the people, but every time he went before YHWH, he took it off.
